

MISSING DIMENSIONS OF POVERTY DATA

A Proposal for Internationally Comparable Indicators of Agency and Empowerment

Version updated: May 2012

This document contains a modified version of the survey questions proposed in the paper 'A Proposal for Internationally Comparable Indicators of Empowerment' 1 prepared for the May 2007 Workshop on Missing Dimensions of Poverty Data.

Notes to enumerators:

This module is *very* important. Of all OPHI's modules, this has created the most interest. But it is also the most challenging for enumerators. They have to be very thoughtful and very careful, so that people understand it clearly. When they do, even illiterate respondents feel quite pleased – it helps them to express their situation fully. We are VERY interested in your inputs, and in ways to strengthen or clarify the questions. Please fill in this questionnaire yourself, slowly, before you apply it to other people. Try to think through each question, and understand it from your own experience.

Empowerment occurs in different domains: one can be empowered as a housewife and mother but disempowered in the workplace; empowered as a citizen where you vote and speak, and in the mosque or church – where you lead a prayer group, but disempowered in making major household decisions, because your husband does not let you. So the core of this module is a set of questions about autonomy and decision-making in different domains:

Autonomy and Decision-making with respect to²:

- 1. Work
- 2. Household duties and caring
- 3. Major household purchases
- 4. Health crisis
- 5. Group participation
- 6. Political participation

The module also includes questions on overall empowerment with respect to one's individual life and one's community including a ladder question. And it includes questions on collective agency – which may be formal political freedom or may relate to civil society activities.

Because the Autonomy questions are new, we introduce them a bit before sharing the questionnaire. The four motivations that we ask about are:

1. clearly coerced – done out of fear of punishment or to gain reward, or

Religion (perhaps instead of political participation)

Savings decisions (perhaps instead of major household purchases)

- 1b. required by **force of circumstance**? (for example, a single mother with young children usually has to do the housework no particular person is forcing her to do it, but she still has to)
- 2. To what extent is it **done to please others** or satisfy social norms and avoid stigma or blame?
- 3. To what extent is it done because the respondent wants to he or she **personally values** the action?
- 4. To what extent does the action advance a value that is deeply held?

The key innovative questions in this module relate to Autonomy. Autonomy questions are drawn from Ryan and Deci and have been verified across cultures, ages, and domains. The questions ask the respondent to say how true **each** of four motivations is. The results are put into a weighted scale to develop a relative autonomy index. Often people ask, why not ask them to choose one motivation—why do they have to score them one by one? Each motivation is scored separately because often we do things for several reasons at the same time (we have mixed motives). In part, we join groups to gain a concrete benefit (small loan); in part to have a good reputation (please others); additionally, we may (or may not) think the work we do is worthwhile; and we may or may not feel that it is really a good match with our skills and deepest values (relationships of solidarity, and working together to create positive change).

Let's give three examples:

Miriam works in a factory and earns a salary – which is very important to her. Manufacturing is thought to be a 'good job' by her family who pushed very hard for her to take this job. But she doesn't enjoy the work; indeed she thinks it is dangerous and boring. She does it for the salary and prestige within her family – only. She is disempowered because she feels coerced, not autonomous with respect to her work.

Another example: Sonia is a dress maker. She has to work as she is a single mother. She could also do a different job that had a more secure income and higher status but chose not to. She doesn't really think about pleasing others – tailoring is what she feels she is good at. She feels very fulfilled by making a dress fit beautifully, and working with the cloth – it is really what she feels she can do best. In the 'work' domain, in which nearly everyone works in part to gain reward, Sonia has relatively high empowerment.

Finally, think of Thomas, who is a cleaner. He has to work to survive, and if he didn't work not only would his family have difficulties, but he would not feel he was being a good husband and father. He is proud that he is honest, that he cleans well, and as a devout person, he finds fulfilment in doing his work well and joyfully, and being helpful to others in the building. But cleaning is not his passion – he is aware that, being uneducated, he cannot do other jobs, so he makes the best he can out of the jobs he has.

Note for pilot: The researchers should verify based on the pilot that the domains selected are easy to understand, distinct from each other, and relevant in the context. Autonomy questions for alternative domains may be found here: (http://www.ophi.org.uk/research/missing-dimensions/empowerment/)

The decision-making and autonomy questions should be preceded by at least one objective question on that domain (or a module – e.g., on respondents' occupation for the domain of work or health after the respective section on health). The reason for this is that the respondent is then already thinking about the domain and finds it easier to answer the autonomy questions. Here we give examples of objective questions and domains we have used in our surveys (e.g. EMP1 or EMP16) but the choice should depend on the context of the survey and research questions being asked. Note that the first time the autonomy questions are asked, they should be preceded by the specific instruction before the questions.

Indicator 1 - Autonomy in different domains; decision-making regarding work
