

# MISSING DIMENSIONS OF POVERTY DATA

## The Ability to Go About Without Shame

## A Proposal for Internationally Comparable Indicators of Shame, Humiliation and Isolation

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This document contains a modified version of the survey questions proposed in the paper 'The Ability to Go About without Shame: A Proposal for Internationally Comparable Indicators of Shame and Humiliation' 1 prepared for the May 2007 Workshop on Missing Dimensions of Poverty Data. The paper recommended that these questions – or a refinement of them – might be considered a module that could be added to nationally representative individual or household surveys. Based on existing indicators from related fields, the following module suggests eight indicators to measure specific aspects of shame and humiliation that could start an in-depth debate around this topic. The indicators are the following:

#### Shame

- 1. Stigma of poverty: whether respondents would feel shame if they were poor
- 2. Shame proneness

#### External experience of humiliation

- 3. Perceptions of respectful treatment
- 4. Perceptions of unfair treatment
- 5. Perceptions of prejudiced treatment
- 6. Perceptions of whether ethnic, racial or cultural discrimination, ethnicity, socio-economic status impedes respondent's chances of obtaining employment, services and education.

#### Internal experience of humiliation

7. Levels of accumulated humiliation.
